# January Technical Program: A2L Refrigerant Updates with CMS

Our first technical presentation is scheduled for 1/30 and will be hosted by CMS, covering the upcoming A2L refrigerant transition. The intent of this presentation is to cover design/installation implications for this changeover, how to comply with the new codes, and how we can engage our local jurisdictions to get everyone up to speed on the requirements and minimize the time it takes for us as a region to become streamlined on this new standard.

- Manufacturers general response to these changes; cost increases, notable delays, factory operational impacts
- Shipping, storage and handling jobsite impacts

  - System impacts; dampers, VAV control and current operating mode impacts (heating/cooling/occupied/unoccupied, etc).
- Mechanical Rooms (water source chillers, WSHPs, indoor AHUs, etc.)
  - Refrigerant choice impacts (mostly chillers vary)
  - o Internal devices sequences
  - Visibility/Integration with DDCs
  - Mechanical Room Space ventilation examples, industry trends and minimizing cost/footprint impacts



## Sustaining ASHRAE Through Leadership









Ron Jarnagin was a friend of mine and encouraged me to continue my ASHRAE volunteer work while I was serving on the Society Membership Promotion Committee. He had an impact on many members in Region XI and was a champion for the Region. He was always focused on training up new members in the region and always looking for the next person to step up and serve. We had many informal meetings to discuss who he saw as potential leaders from Region XI and I watched as he reached out to them and encouraged them. I know how passionate Ron was about ASHRAE and it was hard not to be excited about serving when talking about ASHRAE with him.

He also had an impact on my family. Ron was always engaging with my family when they traveled with me to Region XI CRC's or Society Conferences. Linda and Kaitlin also engaged with our family and made us feel like family friends – even though we only saw one another twice a year. During our first CRC at Sea Ron challenged our two youngest sons to a NASCAR race in the simulators on the cruise ship. They talk about that to this day. Kaitlin also engaged with those two boys during a Welcome Party at Churchill Downs while enjoying non-alcoholic Mint Julips. They have a gift of inclusion and compassion.

Ron will be missed. But his legacy will always be felt in our hearts.

# REMEMBERING RON: PRESIDENTIAL MEMBER RON JARNAGIN (1946-2024)









Ron was such a humble person when it came to his ASHRAE accomplishments. I remember him often saying that he wasn't the one responsible but rather he just found the right person to handle whatever the issue was, and then either got out of the way or provided them the support they needed to succeed. That is a skill that can be sorely lacking and is rarely appreciated when we look at choosing our leaders. But Ron had this skill in abundance.

Ron lived and breathed ASHRAE. He was passionate about keeping it alive when it appeared to be dying on the vine and I sincerely believe his efforts were instrumental in turning the organization around. It was his vision that has allowed the rest of us to enjoy the benefits of what this society can bring.

I will miss the long phone calls we used to have when I was involved in the various positions within the Region. Being the consummate southerner that Ron was, he could truly spin a yarn. But it was always interesting and often entertaining. Sometimes, it was even somewhat relevant to the discussion at hand - LOL!
